LETTER OF CONCERN

RE: Investigation No. 06-08 - Self Report 2006 Renewal Review

Dear Dr. Grossman:

At a meeting held March 14, 2006, the Board considered the above referenced matter. Following discussion the Board voted to issue you a ***non-disciplinary Letter of Concern***. A ***Letter of Concern*** is defined at A.R.S. §32-2901(13) as an advisory letter to notify a physician that, while there is insufficient evidence to support disciplinary action, the board believes the physician should modify or eliminate certain practices.

The referenced complaint came to the Board's attention during the 2006 license renewal process when you disclosed the action with an affirmative response to a question regarding disciplinary actions against licenses held in other licensing authorities.

The Board reviewed the Colorado Board's Letter of Admonishment and correspondence submitted in response to our request for additional information. While there was insufficient evidence to conclude a violation of A.R.S. §32-2933 occurred, the Board expressed concern that had your action occurred in Arizona, it may have led to a possible violation of the rules governing the supervision of medical assistants, specifically, AAC R4-38-301(H)1 through 7.

With the issuance of this letter a copy of which will be retained in your license file, this matter will be administratively closed. Please contact me if you have questions.
